Fire blankets: *a question about expiry dates for fire blankets was asked recently. All educators must have a fire blanket that is easily and quickly available, preferably hanging near the doorway to the kitchen. Fire blankets are ideal for extinguishing cooking fat fires and can be used to wrap around people if their clothes catch on fire. There is not an expiry date but blankets should only be used once and then replaced.*

All fire blankets should carry the Australian Standards Mark AS 3504.
